## **Individual Profile**

Where were you born and where did you grow up?

Born 30 Nov 1960 in Melbourne, Australia

Grew up in Goulburn, NSW from age of 5 to 18 years (before moving to Sydney for the next 28 years)

Where did you play your junior/local cricket or become interested in cricket?

### Goulburn - with Goulburn RSL Club Juniors

When and why did you become involved with UNSWCC?

I had played a season of PG cricket at the Sydney Club (now defunct) in my last year at school (coming from Goulburn each time to play). I did enjoy the people I met there and thought that might be where I would play when I moved to Sydney for Uni. My dad thought I should play for the Uni I attended...and Jim "Jungle" Robson (a Goulburn boy who's cricket talent was already well known to me) contacted me and sold me on the whole UNSWCC idea. I made what I believe was one of the best decisions of my life to rock up to those UNSWCC pre season (1979/80) practises.

What did you like about UNSW Cricket?

Initially because it was clearly an environment in which I would enjoy my cricket and challenge my abilities.

After that...it was the people involved in the Club. It is hard to put a value on being part of a cohesive and supportive family of that size. And the UNSWCC was a VERY unique kind of family. Such a massive part of my life.

What is your Club nickname (Explain who gave it to you and why – if not obvious

### Disco

I had acquired the nickname in my early days at Warrane College and it stuck with me particularly at the Cricket Club.

The basic (boring) story is that a bloke called Steve Cusack walked into my room at Warrane and I had my clock radio on with a disco song playing. He "accused" me of being a disco freak and it seemed to stick/gel with the other blokes at Warrane – possibly my surname meant it would last as a nickname because I was certainly never found at a Disco nor felt any attraction to "Discos" or that genre of music.

Played from 1979/80 to 2006/07

Almost entirely 1<sup>st</sup> grade from 79/80 to 97/98...Predominantly 3<sup>rd</sup> Grade from 98/99 to 2006/07

Captained at various times in 1<sup>st</sup> Grade from 1989/90 as well as in 3<sup>rd</sup> grade for a number of my seasons there

Started my Grade career as solely an opening bowler but "matured" into an allrounder (circa 83/84) and then predominantly a batsman (circa 90/91 or 91/92)

Pretty sure I was on the UNSWCC Committee from approx. my 3<sup>rd</sup> season at the club and held many different roles right through until my move to Canberra.

Treasurer; Chairman of Selectors; Coach; Assistant Coach; Club Administrator; Annual Report productions; SCA delegate.

What did it mean to you to be awarded life membership?

Being awarded Life Membership was clearly one of the proudest moments in my life as a UNSWCC member. I involved myself heavily in everything the Club was involved in (if I could) because I enjoyed it. To be recognised with Life Membership felt like a magnificent reward for doing the stuff I (mostly) loved doing. And very humbling to take note of the people I had joined as a Life Member of UNSWCC.

What is your greatest memory or memories of UNSW Cricket?

So many great (and fading) memories. It was such a massive part of 28 years of my life. Season 80/81 has to be up there...even if illness meant I failed to commit much of the finals' games to memory at the time. But a title in my second season at the Club was big. The "gotta be Happy" 1988 Tour of UK & Ireland.

But clearly, with a cricket career at UNSWCC like mine, the fondest and most significant memories are of the people. Just so many wonderful people that have been such a big part of this huge chunk of my life. Really wonderful friends – too many to name here. But they are my greatest memories because they are the club and they are why I love it.

In saying there are too many to name I think I am being honest but I also think I am potentially doing an injustice to two people whom I think personify UNSWCC for everyone – but particularly for me. Henry (Geoff Lawson) and Jebby (David Jebb)

In what profession or area of work are/were you mainly involved? What are your main interests outside cricket?

Studied Commerce/Law and went straight into a tax consulting role at one of the large Accounting Firms at the time – and spent the next 18 years in that role at, ultimately, 3 of the large accounting firms. Retired from that life and got myself qualified as a Primary School teacher with grand plans to contribute to society in that way – but circumstances (and lack of ability) curtailed that career (It lasted about 3 years). Have been on domestic duties since then. Now very obsessed with my golf and with (too many) social justice issues.
